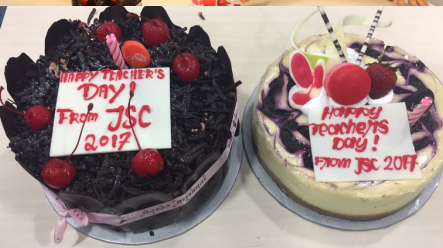

'Kecemerlangan Guru Teras Kejayaan Ummah'

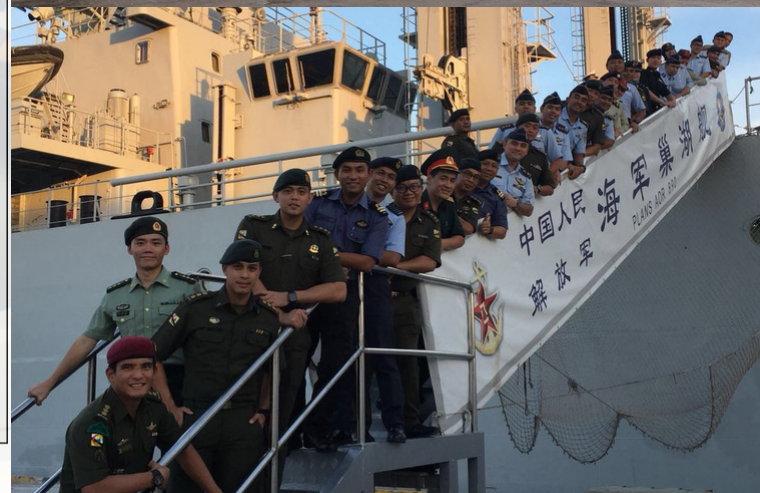

CHINA FRIGATE VISIT

On Tuesday, 26 October 2017, the Junior Staff Course 2017 that consist of 31 officers lead by Lt Col (U) Amiruddin, the Directing staff of LMC DA RBAF, was given the opportunity to do ship-tour on board the People's Liberation Army (PLA) Navy Task Group 150. The fleet, composed of the Destroyer Changchun, Frigate Jingzhou and supply ship Chaohu. Brunei is the 18th country that the fleet has visited since it set sail from Shanghai on April 23 for a six-month-long ocean-going visit mission. In which, the fleet is scheduled to pay port calls to more than 20 countries in Asia, Europe, Africa and Oceania.

The delegation was given a tour-brief on the destroyer Changchun with the pennant number 150, a newly commissioned anti-air guided missile destroyer setting sails as the new flagship of China's East Sea Fleet. Then the delegation toured into the frigate Jingzhou, where it was made primarily for air-defense and capable of performing anti-surface and anti-submarine Warfare (ASW) missions. The ship's radar can track up to 40 targets simultaneously at a maximum range of approximately 120 km and the Harbin Z-9, the anti-submarine helicopter that is carried on board of the ship was also introduced. The tour ended after touring the supply ship Chaohu. The tour was well organised and provided naval-based knowledge for the Junior Staff Course delegation as some personnel are yet to experience naval life. The Chinese fleet wrapped up its friendly visit to Brunei and left Muara Port on September 27, 2017.



NON-OPERATIONAL STAFF DUTIES

The main agenda during week 4 was on Non-Operational Staff duties. This module aims to sharpen writing correspondence with precise and complete information set into structures and correct formats. The subject covered on Routine Letter, Demi Official Letter, Administrative Instruction and Written brief. There was also a practice assessment for Non-Operational Staff Duties as preparation for the actual exam.

From this module, most student had realised their wrong practices in writing letters previously. Furthermore, students also learned the different types of formats for different situations. For all the foreign officers, this is a good opportunity for them to learn the Non-Operational Staff duties which are practiced in RBAF. In addition to this, they will be able to utilise the technical skill of letter writing to be applied upon return to their country.

In Week 5, one of the subject covered is Meeting Minute. During this week, all student were introduced to proper techniques to constructing Meeting Minutes. Prior to this, some student had never written any minutes before. Hence, this module provided good opportunities for them to learn and practise that correct structure. The Non-Operational Staff Duties module ended with the final exam completed on Wednesday, 4 October 2017.

Following the completion of this module, students will be able to apply all the good practises they have learned and also avoid past mistakes. Besides that, they will be able to correct errors in letters written by their subordinates, as well as to cascade these good practises to their subordinates, and hence will smoothen administration of RBAF.
