TEAM BUILDING

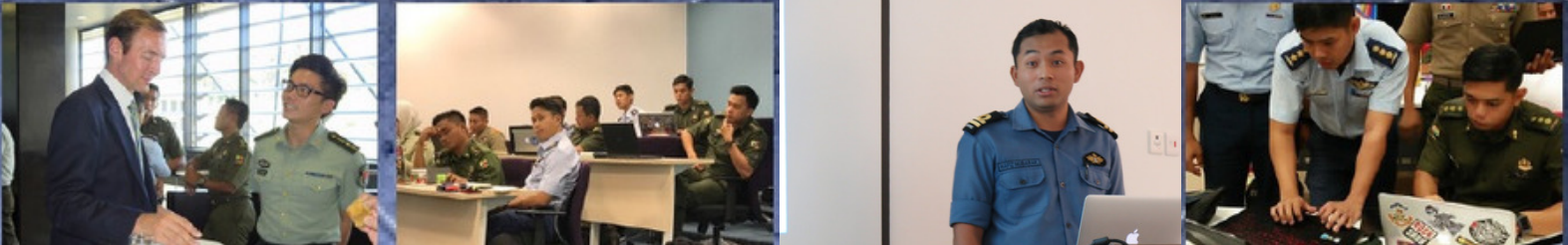
